

Admissions Data – Master of Teaching Exceptions Reporting

On rare occasions a candidate with a WAM of less than 60 might be offered a place. Such candidates are treated as individual cases, and acceptance into the course is at the course coordinators' discretion and based on extenuating circumstances in the candidate's background. Examples of extenuating circumstances are candidates with relevant industry experience, candidates who have valid reason (such as ill health) for obtaining lower marks during undergraduate degree, and other cases where candidates can be offered a place according to university policy for equity and social inclusion. See below for aggregated data showing range of WAM for entrants to the MTeach course from 2015 – 2019, and number of offers made to applicants with a WAM below 60.

Year	Total number of entrants	Range of WAM	Number and percent below WAM of 60
2015	76	55.6 – 82.125	5 = 6.57%
2016	80	57.51 – 82.71	7 = 8.75%
2017	126	52.0 – 88.25	9 = 7.14%
2018	180	54.2 – 87.75	7 = 3.9%
2019	124	57.22 – 88.2	5 = 4.03%
